Dinghy Race Report from Nigel Paul

19 sailors took to the water on Sunday, for 3 more heats of the windward series.

It was as if the river had breathed a collective sigh, after a few weeks of hot, dry easterlies and offshore troughs - finally the robust southerly could make it through. And come through it did, between 18 and twenty knots.

Attrition rate was high, but luckily we had one of our most experienced sailors in the safety "whaley" (Mal) buzzing around looking after everyone, and towing a few to shore.

The final race saw 11 lasers left, and word from our starters was that all 11 were on the start line, at full speed for the hooter and making quite a sight. I definitely noticed the last start to be the most contested and had to put in some extra tacks to try and get clean air.

Memorable moment:

Mal had expertly positioned the bottom mark, making the lay line bisect the centre of the start line. As the start line was a no go area, this created a tactical race on the downwind "sausage" - to go left or right, that was the question!

The first race leg I went left, but had to gybe in pressure at the mark - always an interesting proposition.

Going right you could gybe around the outer end of the start line (which always appeared to be lighter winds) and come in to the bottom mark with the sail on the right side for a rounding.

The memorable moment came when Scott M took the equation even further, heading a further 50 meters out to the right, looking for more pressure.

After gybing once he found the pressure, he proceeded to absolutely fly to the bottom mark, at multiples of our speed, to take the lead.

There is always a hard luck story - Travis thought we were starting the usual 5 minute sequence - so in the first race missed the start by a fair margin. As luck would have it he missed the start sequence in race 2 as well. Oh what could have been Trav - you still came in 3rd fastest time.

Thanks to our hard working volunteers - the 15 minute races kept them very busy starting and then recording finishers. Hope you guys had time for your tea and scones!

Next Sunday hopefully marks the return to sailing (after dates with their surgeons) for two of our club laser stalwarts (Mal and Mark) so we can look forward to even more close racing!
