Competitors in each race will be scored on their across-the-line position using the Low Points System (LPS).

One(1) Point for First, Two(2) Points for Second, Three(3) Points for Third, etc.

Points will be accumulated over the five races, the yacht with the Least amount of points will the winner.

DINGHY NEWS

Sunday 24th October

Sunday 24th October, I turned up at the club another year older and a tad late. So many boats on the lawn.

It was the first day of the Windward Series. 3 heats, all windward returns. A beautiful morning. The wind swung to the SW as we rigged up, fairly light, 5-10 knots.

The announcement was made, before we left the beach, any boat over the line in the last minute before the start would be disqualified. Not a problem for me, I struggled to get across the line a minute after the start. That leads me to the biggest surprise of the day, jumping to the end; how did I get to write this report? I had 3 shocking starts, great plans, poor execution. Having started so poorly I took little notice of the other 24 boats except those that crossed my path and therefore struggle to be informative in this script.

In race 1 Andrew Brooks was the fastest full rig with Scott Francis the fastest radial. Andrew's time was 17m 53s, with Colin and Matt close behind and the last boat crossing 6 minutes later. Looking at all the boats ahead of me it seemed there was some sport at the top mark on each occasion we rounded. I did not hear any yelling or screaming, we were our usual polite group, but some brushing up on the rules might be in order. There was one disqualification, I assume for the crime of which we warned.

Having made it round the track once I was determined to do better. Race two started in a similar way, a line of boats all the way from the boat to the pin. Behind this line Ross and I drifted together, blanketed from the breeze. Humorous comments were exchanged, and we slowly went our own ways. Now my plan was to start a little late, on port, at the boat end and clear the fleet. As I crossed the line, at what felt like a minute late, I saw Don had executed my plan flawlessly, arriving at the top mark in one tack and earning the fastest time for the full rig in a smart 14 minutes. Duncan was 30 seconds behind and Nigel a full minute. Will Nunn was the fastest radial. Sean suffered a failure with a mischievous shackle and ducked into shore. I improved my performance by two places. There was one DSQ!

OK, now I've got the start signals worked out and the watch set properly. Perhaps this was the race that Ross and I watched all the others sail off, oh well, why ruin a good story.

Colin Dibb was the fastest around a shortened course in 7m 31s with Nigel close behind. Scott repeated his first race effort with the fastest radial. I split the difference with my first two races, so I guess that means I was consistent. No one was disqualified in race 3.

The starters and rescue boat earned their stripes with 3 races, moving the start line, 18 full rigs and 7 radials clamouring for position. Our many thanks, a good day was had.
