COMMODORE'S CUP

1 Rules

The race will be governed by the current rules as defined in the Yachting Australia (YA) [Racing Rules of Sailing for 2021-2024](#), the CYC Commodore's Cup Sailing Instructions (the Sailing Instructions), and the rules of the class(es) or associations sailed (except as altered by the Sailing Instructions).

2 Eligibility and Entry

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all Keelboats, Lasers, 420 Dinghies (Jib and Main only), and the CYC Junior Dinghy (Tackers).
- 2.2 Six (6) yachts are required to form a Fleet; otherwise yachts will be incorporated in the appropriate division.
- 2.3 Eligible boats can enter online via the Australian Sailing [CYC Commodore's Cup 2022](#)
- 2.4 For any other problems registering online or general race enquiries, please email the Office at reception@claremontyachtclub.org.au
- 2.5 Online entries close at **2400hrs Tuesday 15 March 2022**.
- 2.6 Late entry may be accepted at the discretion of the Principal Race Officer (PRO) and/or Race Committee.
- 2.7 If accepted, late entries will sail with the maximum handicap or a handicap of one (1.000) as specified by the PRO and/or Race Committee.

3 **Fees**

4 **Schedule of Event**

4.1 A preparatory signal will be made at 1355hrs with the first fleet starting at 1400hrs and subsequent fleets starting in 5-minute intervals.

4.2 Subject to availability of results, presentation of prizes will be made in the Deepdene room at approximately 17:30hrs.

5 **Sailing Instructions**

5.1 The sailing instructions will be available from [Claremont Yacht Club's website](#).

5.2 A limited number of hardcopies will be available in the Deepdene room on the day of the race.

6 **Courses**

6.1 The course for keelboats will be a short reaching course similar to the course first sailed in 1905 and as described in the sailing instructions.

6.2 The Lasers and 420 Dinghies will sail laps of Karrakatta Bank, the number of which will be determined by the PRO and CYC Senior Dinghy Captain on the day of the race when the number of fleets and weather conditions are known.

7 **Radio Communications**

7.1 Except in the case of an emergency, a boat shall neither make transmit or receive information that is not freely available to all boats while racing.

7.2 CYC Race Control will monitor VHF Channel 77.

8 **Mooring/Berthing**

8.1 Temporary mooring space will be available after racing for competitors to attend onshore festivities.

8.2 Overnight mooring must be authorised by CYC Sailing Committee prior to the event.

8.3 Launching ramp facilities will be available on the race day.

8.4 Due to limited space, only CYC Senior Members can park vehicles on Club grounds.

8.5 However, we can make arrangements for trailers of visiting yachts. If you require trailer parking please notify the Club prior to the event.

9 Prizes and Presentations

- 9.1 Subject to availability of results, presentations will be made in the Deepdene as close to 1730 hours as possible.
- 9.2 Presentations will be made to the winner of each Fleet.
- 9.3 In addition to receiving a memento trophy, the name of the overall keelboat winner will be engraved on the "Commodore's Cup".
- 9.4 CYC keelboat members will be racing for the "Deepdene Trophy".
