
RESULTS:

The CYC fleet was reduced because our fearless leader is away on hols, and the Spacesailer 22 state heat was run at CYC. Notwithstanding, there were 3 CYC boats that took to the water. There was some conjecture at the start – something regarding “do we go when the blue peter drops or when the class flag drops?” In any event, somebody got off to a good start (so I’m told). Of course, the weather did its usual thing and blew its guts out . Our little fleet is getting used to the conditions...and everybody handled it well.

SS22 State Heat

I think the weather affected the SS22 fleet as well...as there were only 5 boats fighting it out in the 3rd race of the 7 race series. Krista was the sole representative for CYC. One thing I’ve learned about buying an old boat...you spend the first season breaking stuff and fixing stuff...then you can go sailing! We had a problem with the outhaul on the mainsail...by the time we fixed that...we noticed the Blue Peter was up...so we hightailed it back to the line...just made it back in time...but were last over when the gun went off. Then, on our first tack after we crossed the line...I heard a crack in the tiller...looked down...and realised the bloody think was about to come off in my hand. I was short-handed as our foredeck called in sick on the morning...so I said to the fellas...”I know there’s some electrical tape downstairs...find whatever you can...and lets get this sorted.
